#### PERFECT SURVEYS

In October, MRSI held its Staff Appreciation Day event. Staff enjoyed a delicious meal of pulled pork, mac & cheese, baked beans and a wide variety of sweet desserts. Numerous awards were given out for various criteria such as attendance, creativity, positive personality, etc. Committee members spent many hours discussing candidates along with the criteria that need to be met to earn the award before making a final decision on the recipient(s). This year our Wayne Street Home earned the Teamwork Award for 2024. The employees at this location have worked hard as a team to ensure the individuals living at the home receive high quality care while also ensuring the tedious paperwork/electronic documentation is done in a timely manner. In addition, the staff are frequently pulled in several directions as an individual who lives in the home may want to go out shopping or attend another community activity, another individual may have a medical appointment, grocery shopping may need to be done for the home and other individuals may need a meal prepared, medications administered, etc. Oh, don't forget, staff go to the emergency room day or night when a resident becomes sick. The list goes on and on of what staff are asked to do on a daily/weekly basis. Staff have to stay on top of what is going on to ensure high quality care continues to be provided.

When staff least expect it, State surveyors then show up to complete their reviews on the home. In less than 1 month, the WSGH has been through 2 State surveys. On October 22<sup>nd</sup> and October 23<sup>rd</sup>, the Ohio Department of Health was at the Wayne Street Home to complete their annual review. On November 19<sup>th</sup>, the WSGH had its DODD survey. Anytime State regulators are at a location, staff become stressed as they fear they will make a mistake causing a citation to be issued. The staff at the Wayne Street Home did an outstanding job and all the work they perform each day paid off. The home received perfect surveys.

#### **COMMUNITY GENEROSITY**

#### MERCER COUNTY CIVIC FOUNDATION

Mercer County Civic Foundation awards grant funds to Mercer Residential Services, Inc. In 11/2024, a \$10,950 grant from the Mercer County Civic Foundation (MCCF) is helping to replace a fire panel in one of Mercer Residential Services (MRSI) mental health housing units in Celina. MRSI has been providing housing to individuals facing mental health challenges since 1998. Many of these individuals have a difficult time maintaining employment as well as securing housing. The apartment units come furnished and provide safe and affordable housing to tenants while also providing the individuals the opportunity to be a viable part of the community. The fire panel in MRSI's family unit has outlived its life expectancy and is in need of being replaced. The fire panel is connected to a fire monitoring system and the fire department will be notified and dispatched immediately in the event fire is detected. We cannot express our humble gratitude enough for the funds we received. MRSI is very appreciative of everything the Mercer County Civic Foundation does to support everyone in Mercer County.

#### MENTAL HEALTH HOUSING

Did you know that Mercer Residential Services also provides Mental Health Housing? MRSI has 2 six plex units (6 apts. in 1 building) and a duplex in Celina. There is also a six plex unit in Van Wert. The apartments come furnished with a couch, bed, kitchen table and chairs and appliances. There is also a washer and dryer in each building. MRSI has been busy upgrading the apartments, when able to, with fresh paint and laminate flooring. Recently, Tri County ADAMHS Board provided MRSI with a grant to purchase appliances, equipment and upgrades for the mental health housing units in Mercer and Van Wert counties. Due to the generosity of the Tri County ADAMHS Board, MRSI was able to upgrade the apartment units' camera systems, purchase outdoor patio furniture for each of the six plex buildings and replace a total of 13 appliances! Grants like these are very well appreciated as they assist MRSI to continue providing safe, affordable and comfortable housing for our tenants.
