Spring sure did pop up here at Gay Street. We celebrated Easter with our friends and staff with an egg hunt and lots of yummy food.



FROM THE NURSES

Summer is here, and with it comes the risk of heat-related illnesses. Protect yourself and those around you by taking simple precautions. <u>Stay hydrated</u>, drink plenty of fluids throughout the day, even if you don't feel thirsty. <u>Stay cool</u>, seek air conditioning, cool shaded areas, or use fans for increased air circulation and ventilation during the hottest hours of the day. <u>Protect your skin</u>, apply sunscreen with an SPF of at least 30 to all exposed skin. Reapply every 2 hours or more frequently if swimming or sweating. <u>Check on others</u>, check on elderly, medically fragile, young children, and infants, those most vulnerable to heat to ensure they're staying cool and hydrated. <u>Know the signs</u> of heat-related illness. Be aware of the symptoms of heat cramps, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke. For more information check out the CDC website topic on Heat Health.
